

Implement 3-year picturing to my business plan. Make a list of goals and objectives that is highly achievable within the next three years and share it with the team so everyone can stay on the same page in terms of the company's vision.
Instill focus, discipline, and accountability throughout the company so everyone can stick to a long-term vision.
Read entrepreneurial books that can help me improve my skill set and mindset. Research successful business owners in my niche and find out if they've written good books that contain their success stories and business advice.
Evaluate my traits to find out if I'm an entrepreneur at heart. According to Gino Wickman, the essential traits of a successful entrepreneur are visionary, passionate, problem solver, driven, risk-taker, and responsible.
Acquire a right-hand person to help me run my company. A successful organization is composed of a visionary and an integrator. If I can't be both, having someone to fill the void will enormously spike up the business' productivity.
